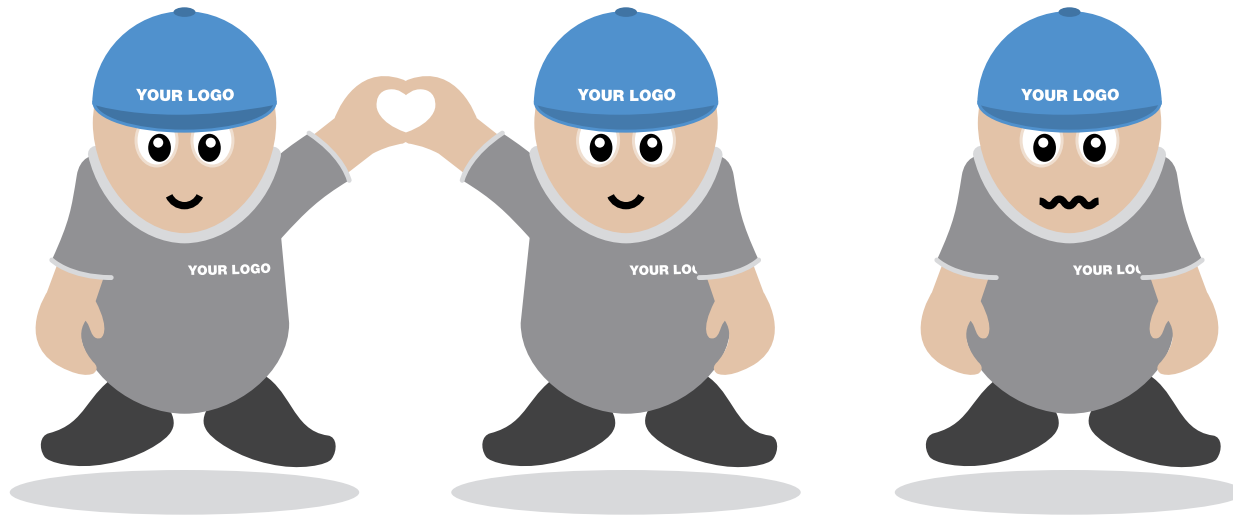
What is employee engagement and why is it important?

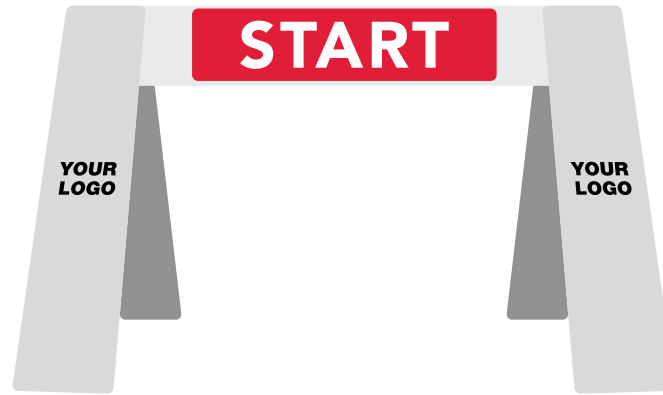
'Employee engagement' is the latest buzz-word (or, in this case, buzz-phrase) in business. Sometimes buzz-words don't mean much at all.

But employee engagement is different – it's all about how much you love your work and the company. We think that is important and we hope you do too.

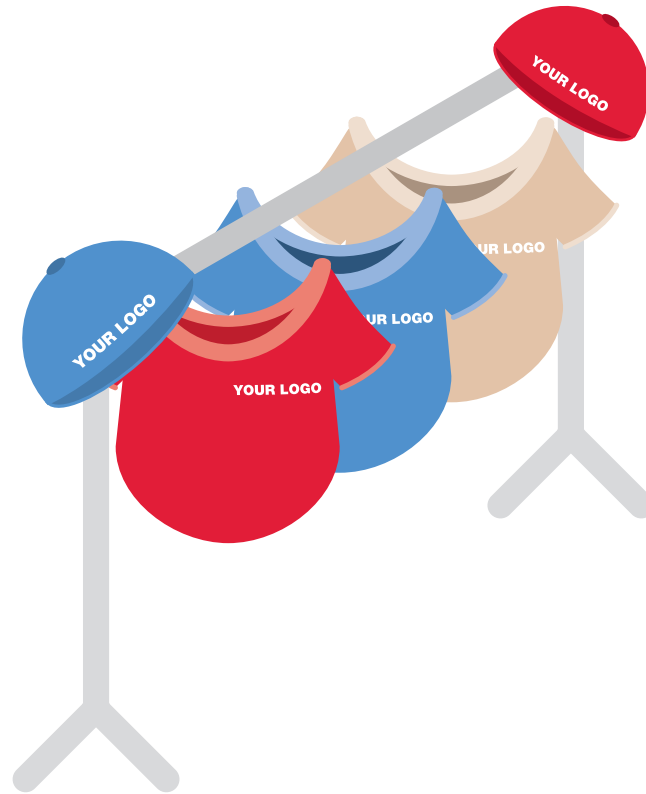
Hands up if you look forward coming to work, have a really good relationship with your boss and colleagues, love your job and feel proud to be working here.




This Discovery Guide contains all sorts of stuff to help you to understand yourself and how to get the most from your work (and from your life too).
